Recyling Tips

The Finer Points of Recycling Protocol

- If you gather your recyclables in a plastic bag, please do not drop the bag itself into the bin. Most plastic bags are not recyclable. Brown paper bags are recyclable. It is the common plastic bags used by the supermarkets that are not recyclable.
- We are recycling, not composting, please do not put any food or other compostable items in the recycling dumpsters.
- Plastic bottles numbered 1 to 7 (look on the bottom or side of the bottle) are recyclable. Rinsed out plastic food tubs such as those for butter spread, cottage cheese, etc.) are acceptable if they are labeled with the recycling symbol and a number 1 to 7. Unlabeled tubs are not recyclable and should not go into the bins.
- When recycling plastic and glass bottles, please remove the caps and dispose
 of them in the trash. Bottle caps are not recyclable.
- Batteries, electronics and CFL bulbs are not included in our recycling service with South Waste. Please do not put these items in the bins.
- Old tires, used computers, printers, and old TVs are not to be placed in our recycle or trash dumpsters.
- Old mattresses, sofas, and other furniture, used refrigerators, failed hot water tanks, should not be placed in the recycle or trash dumpsters.



Household Trash

Please ensure that your household trash is bagged and securely tied before tossing it in the dumpsters.

Vehicles

Parking is limited – Two vehicles per property are allowed on site. Please be courteous when using visitor parking space. No mechanical work on vehicles in the parking lot or garages.

Leasing Units – Owners leasing their units must provide a copy of the lease and the names and contact information of those residing in the home.

No unit can be leased for a period less than six months.

BE SAFE DURING THE HOLIDAYS

Here are some smart safety tips to remember throughout the year and especially during the busy holiday season:

- 1) Be careful when tossing personal information (bills, credit card receipts, bank statements, healthcare information, etc.) into the dumpsters. Shred these items to avoid identity theft.
- 2) Do not leave packages, valuables in your vehicle and do not leave your vehicle unlocked.
- 3) Make sure the doors of your home are locked at all times. If you have a security system, activate it when away from home.
- 4) Don't let newspapers or packages sit outside for extended periods. If you plan to be away, ask a neighbor to collect these items.
- 5) Keep your porch light on and remember to close garage doors.

Our snow removal contractor is Keesen. Plowing of the parking lot and roadways will be triggered at 4" of snow fall and 2" for the sidewalks. Depending upon the temperatures, north facing sidewalks, may be shoveled at a trace. Please sweep away any excess ice melt from your front stoop to protect the concrete and if you have a balcony, remember to remove snow accumulations to avoid damage to the balcony wood.

Because Colorado is known for warmer temperatures during the day, followed by freezing temperatures at night, ice may develop despite the snow removal efforts. Please be extra cautious during the colder winter months venturing outdoors in the snow and ice.
